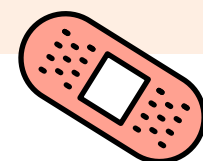


# Recommended Vaccination Schedule for Children In Hong Kong

| Age       | Immunisation Recommended  |

| 4 months  | DTaP-IPV Vaccine - Second Dose<br>Pneumococcal Vaccine - Second Dose  |
| 6 months  | DTaP-IPV Vaccine - Third Dose<br>Hepatitis B Vaccine - Third Dose   |

DTaP- IPV Vaccine: Diphtheria, Tetanus, acellular Pertussis & Inactivated Poliovirus Vaccine

DTap-IPV Vaccine: Diphtheria (*reduced dose*), Tetanus, acellular Pertussis (*reduced dose*) & Inactivated Poliovirus Vaccine

\*Children born on or after 1.7.2018 receive MMRV vaccine at 18 months old in Maternal and Child Health Centres. Children born between 1.1.2013 and 30.6.2018 receive MMRV vaccine in Primary 1.

<sup>^</sup>Starting from the 2019/20 school year, eligible female students will receive the first dose of 9-valent HPV vaccine at Primary 5. They will receive the second dose when they reach Primary 6 in the next school year.

If the child is leaving Hong Kong, please remember to arrange follow up of his/her immunisations at the destination.

Other vaccines not included in the above programme are available in private clinics. These vaccines include influenza vaccine, Haemophilus influenzae type b vaccine, meningococcal vaccine, hepatitis A vaccine, Japanese encephalitis vaccine, rotavirus vaccine and combined vaccines which contain a combination of various vaccine components. Parent should seek advice from doctors before getting their children immunised.
